Before the dance:

- Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, 408-871-9525 of any needed change to assigned dates.
- Purchase and bring 6 to 8 lbs ice for the water cooler.
- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by **6:30 PM**. A Katydid's member with a key will open the doors.
- Sweep floor as necessary and set up tables and chairs.
- Make ice water.
- Start hot water for tea and coffee.

During Club dance:

- Welcome everyone at the sign-in table.
- Collect a **\$5.00** donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds – 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner.
- Check that water and cups do not run out.

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- ALL MEMBERS: **Clean up!** Help pack up supplies and jugs and put into the Club cupboard.
- **Remove non-recyclable trash accidentally tossed into the designated recycle bins.** Take the trash bags out to the dumpster located in the side parking lot.

TRIP REPORT:

**Maxine & Lloyd Darknell and Pat Angotti & Roger Smith's Trip to the 62<sup>nd</sup> National Square Dance Convention, June 26<sup>th</sup> to June 29<sup>th</sup>**

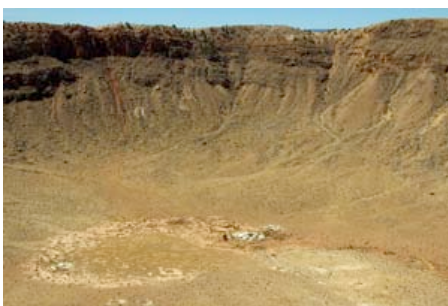
Last year, the four of us drove to the National Convention held in Spokane, Washington, and enjoyed the dancing and visiting new areas so much that we signed up for the next Convention which was going to be held in Oklahoma City. This location and getting there was familiar to Maxine who traveled Route 66 for many summers as a child, going to Oklahoma and Missouri with her family to visit relatives. For the others, this was pretty much all new territory so we decided to drive.

We started our trip on Thursday June 20<sup>th</sup>, and drove to St. George, Utah, to visit our friends and previous Katydid Club Members, Bob and Annie Bennett. We enjoyed hanging out with them in their beautiful home for our first two nights on the road. We left after lunch on Saturday, driving through beautiful Mt. Zion Park (we didn't stop because we had visited the Park



with Bob and Annie on a previous visit) and headed toward Winslow, AZ where we would spend the night. If you remember the song, "Take it Easy" by the Eagles in 1972, part of the song says "I'm a standing on a corner in Winslow, Arizona". So we stood on the corner of Main Street, "Took it Easy" and visited their souvenir shops.

The next morning we backtracked to visit the site of a "Meteor Crater" that crashed over 50,000 years ago. The visitor's center showed a DVD



and had lots of pictures, artifacts and information of its history with a wonderful outdoor area where you could look and see the whole crater. It is nearly one mile across, 2.4 miles in circumference and more than 550 feet deep. One part of its interesting history was from 1964 through 1972, NASA used the crater to provide extensive science training for the Apollo astronauts.

We spent our 4<sup>th</sup> night in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and spent the next morning visiting the "Wheels Museum" of trains and then headed up to Santa Fe, to visit the Rail-



road Museum there. After lunch we drove to Amarillo, TX for our next stay.

The next morning, Tuesday, we headed on the last leg of our trip to Oklahoma City,

where we would be spending the next 6 days dancing and sightseeing. Several miles before getting to the city, we

started seeing large wind mills which had blown over along with lots of large, out of place objects lying in the fields on both sides



of the highway. This was part of the area where the second tornado earlier in the summer had traveled. We spent part of another day visiting the town of Moore where the first and most severe tornado had gone through. It was unbelievable to see the large areas of homes, etc. where everything was swiped away and see the damage to areas that were on the edge where it came through.

Also, during the convention, we took time to visit: the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum which was so large, it took half a day to see; the Oklahoma Train Museum; the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum for the Alfred Murrah Federal Building bombing. It was very "moving" to see the videos and displays. Pat and Maxine visited the Oklahoma City Museum of Art and Maxine and Lloyd visited the Oklahoma Science Museum. We enjoyed lots of nice restaurants, especially Toby Keith's Restaurant which had lots of interesting artifacts and a very good menu including fried cat fish which three of us ordered and enjoyed!

Our hotel, The Renaissance, was very nice and convenient with a bridge connecting to the convention

center. We didn't have to go outside, though the heat wasn't too bad that week, unless we wanted to go to a different restaurant or go sightseeing. We danced in various halls throughout the weekend with lots of different callers and especially danced when Tork, Roger, or Mike Luna were calling. We danced in both Plus and Mainstream halls with lots to choose from. Of course Pat and Maxine went shopping for square dance clothes. Maxine says Pat bought the most! They had about 4000 dancers in attendance from all over the world. Would you believe we signed up for the 63<sup>rd</sup> Convention, which will be next year in Little Rock, Arkansas? Lloyd has declared "no more driving, let's take the train"! Why don't you consider joining us!



We headed towards home on Sunday morning, June 30. When we arrived back in Arizona, we drove through the Painted Dessert and Petrified Forest Parks, stopping at their visitor centers, and spent the night in Holbrook, leaving early the next morning. Driving through Flagstaff, we detoured off the main highway to visit the Arizona Historical Society Pioneer Museum, located in a 1908, two storied home. Part of its history was as a hospital for the indigent people. They had lots of interesting exhibits and things to see, especially a 1908 homesteader's furnished cabin, farming equipment (a lot of which Roger remembered seeing on his grandfather's farm) and a Baldwin, 1929 articulated locomotive used in the lumbering industry in Northern, Arizona.

Monday afternoon, we visited the Barstow Historic Train Station which used to be a "Harvey House". Lloyd really enjoyed this stop because there are trains going by or switching tracks constantly. We spent our last night there .in Barstow, CA. and arrived home on Tuesday afternoon, July 2

### From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -

#### MIX-IN-THE-PAN CHERRY CAKE

- Preheat oven to 350°F
- 13x9 inch cake pan
- 1/4 c. vegetable oil
- 1 pkg (18.25 oz) white cake mix
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 c. water
- 1 can (19 oz) cherry pie filling

Pour oil into pan. Tilt pan to coat bottom with oil. Sprinkle dry cake mix evenly on top. Add eggs and water. Stir all together with a fork or spoon until thoroughly blended, about 2 minutes. Scrape sides and spread batter evenly in pan. Drop spoonfuls of pie filling randomly on top. With a fork or knife, fold pie filling into batter just enough to create a marble effect. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out lean. Cool cake at least 30- minutes in pan on a wire rack before cutting.

And a town map – modern style.

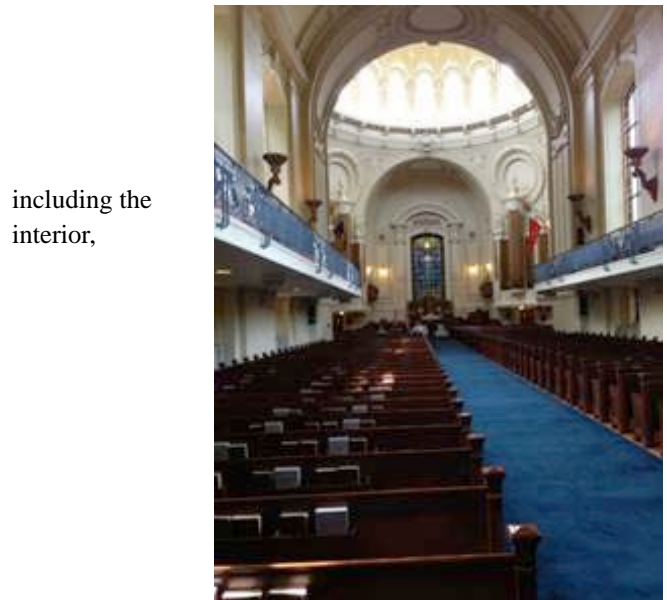
No visit to Annapolis is complete without a tour of the Naval Academy.

including the interior,

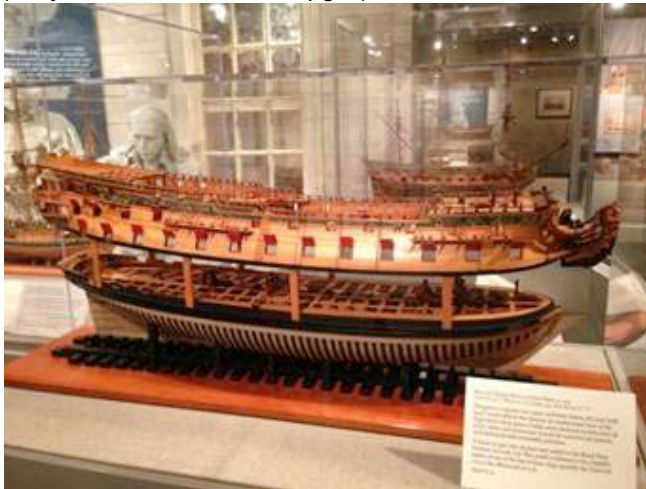


and the crypt of John Paul Jones.

We got to visit with Sherry Dudeck, a young polka-dancing friend from Binghamton days.

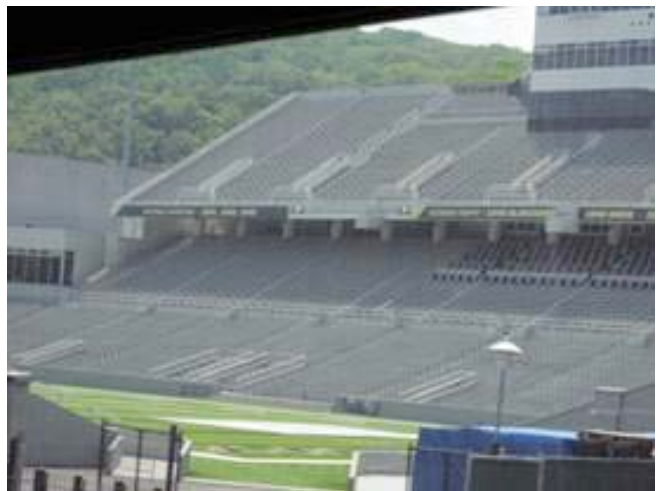


And a fun visit after several years with Trisha Tavolacci, my step-daughter.

**From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -**

**MISSISSIPPI MUD CAKE**

Serves 12 to 16

Preheat oven to 350°F  
grease a 13x9 inch cake pan

Cake

- 1 -pkg (18.25 oz) devil’s food cake mix
- 1 c. sour cream
- 1/2 c. cold strong black coffee
- 1/2 c. vegetable oil

In a large mixer bowl, combine cake mix, eggs, sour cream, coffee and oil. Beat on medium speed or 2 minutes or until smooth. Spread batter evenly in prepared pan. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Topping

- 3 c. miniature marshmallows
- 1 c. pecans, chopped (toasted, optional)

Sprinkle marshmallows and nuts over cake as soon as it comes out of oven. Bake 5 minutes longer or until marshmallows puff. Remove from oven. Cool 30 minutes in pan on wire rack.

Chocolate Drizzle

- 3 squares (1 oz each) semi-sweet chocolate

In a small saucepan over low heat, melt chocolate and butter or microwave on Medium for 2 minutes. Stir until smooth. Drizzle over marshmallow-nut layer. Serve warm or cool to room temperature before cutting.

**From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -**

**CINNAMON CHOCOLATE CAKE**

Preheat oven to 350°F

Coat 2-9” cake pans with cooking spray

- 1 -pkg (18.25 oz) dark chocolate fudge cake mix
- 1 1/3 c. milk
- 1/2 cup oil
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 c. mini chocolate chips
- 5 t. ground cinnamon

- On low speed, beat cake mix, 1 1/3 c. of the milk, oil, and eggs until blend, 30 seconds.
- On medium speed, beat 2 minutes.
- Stir in 2 1/2 t. cinnamon and mini chips.
- Evenly divide batter between pans.
- Bake 28 to 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.
- Cool 10 minutes
- Add 2 1/2 t. cinnamon to your favorite chocolate frosting.
